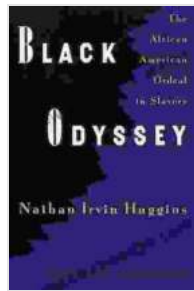

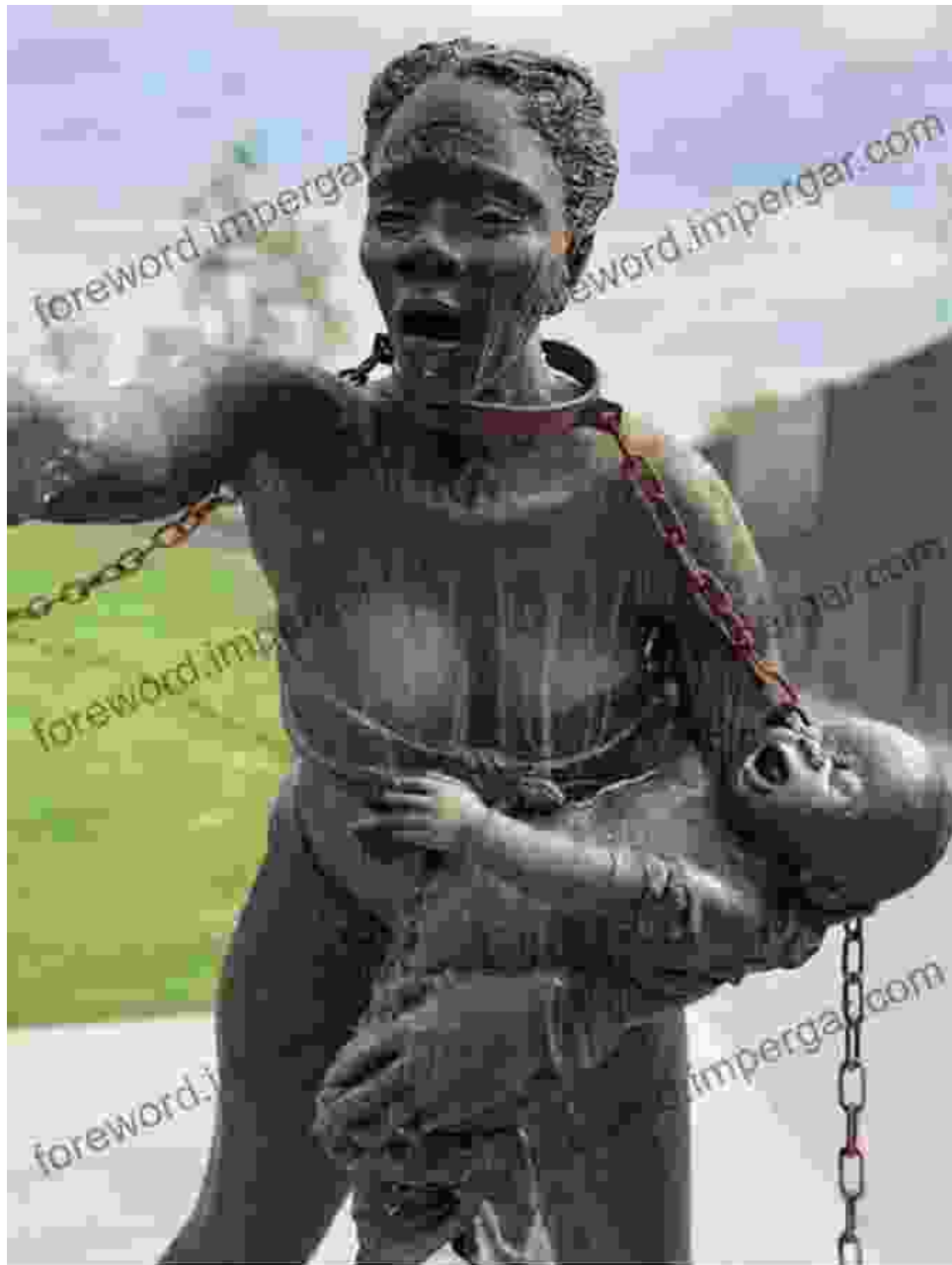

- 3 They are reflections on the past... so are usually created after the events depicted, not at the time

WORK ON EVIDENCE

is concerned with comprehension, inference, assessment of their utility and reliability

WORK ON INTERPRETATIONS

is concerned with how they are created, their purpose, audience and validity

How far is the interpretation supported by the available evidence? How accurately has the creator used the evidence to make the interpretation?
5. What parts are fact, opinion & imagination? _____
What is the balance between fact and opinion? Which parts are merely imagination?

6. How has the interpretation been shaped by the context it was made in? _____
How has the interpretation been influenced by the ideology, values, nationality, personality and operations of the period in which it was created? BUT... be wary of over-speculating about the society it originated in

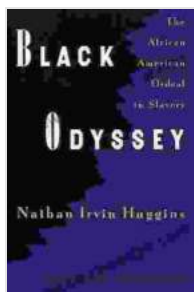
