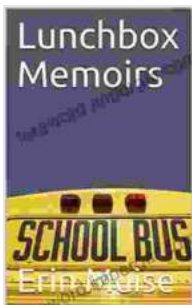


Lunchbox Memoirs: Erin Remembers

- The day I accidentally spilled my juice box all over my new backpack, and my mom had to wash it for me.

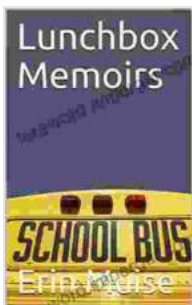
