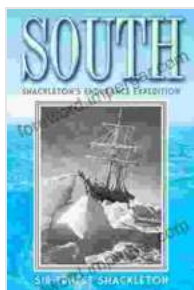


The Endurance Expedition: A Tale of Survival and Courage in Antarctica

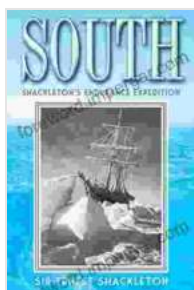
