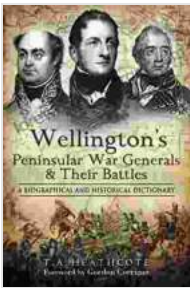

General Rowland Hill

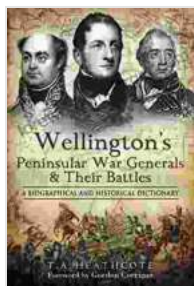
General John Moore
